Abstract

The Techno-Humanities Research Centre (the Centre) at Caritas Institute of Higher Education is established to promote the use and development of technology in humanities research, provide technological facilities to colleagues to conduct research on technohumanities, provide a platform for research collaboration on techno-humanities among tertiary institutions in Hong Kong, and create a network of techno-humanities scholars to advance academic study of this field.

To achieve the above objectives, the Centre will form a number of research units to conduct projects on the humanities, acquire digital resources for research, publish a refereed journal entitled *Journal of Techno-Humanities*, run a book series Routledge Studies in Techno-Humanities, hold international conferences and organize workshops and seminars to promote the academic study of techno-humanities in Hong Kong, and develop technologies for research in the humanities.
